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ABOUT LINCOLN

The Town of Lincoln holds a prominent location in Ontario's Niagara Peninsula. As one of the fastest-growing communities in Niagara, Lincoln is an ideal place to establish or expand your business. Lincoln is a recognized Agricultural Centre of Excellence with thriving agriculture, food and beverage, technology, manufacturing and tourism sectors. Promoting an "Open for Business" message and attracting new investment are key drivers towards economic growth and prosperity in Lincoln.

Lincoln is situated along the QEW and the Niagara Escarpment, with scenic frontage on Lake Ontario. Beamsville serves as the administrative centre and main business area, while other population clusters include Vineland, Jordan, Campden, Rockway, Tintern, and the future Prudhommes development. Lincoln's superior natural beauty features the waterfront and picturesque Jordan Harbour, orchards, vineyards, and conservation areas. Lincoln's highly productive agriculture sector thrives thanks to the region's fertile soil and the temperature moderating effects of Lake Ontario and the Niagara Escarpment. The latter is recognized as an environmentally protected UN World Biosphere Reserve, making the escarpment and the land in its vicinity as internationally significant.

The Town of Lincoln's population increase between 2016 and 2021 exceeded previous growth targets as established in the 2016 Lincoln Official Plan and exceeded overall growth across Niagara Region. The Town is working to provide diverse housing stock well within the reach of many families so that residents of all backgrounds and lifestyles can find a place to call home within our community.










LINCOLN'S COMMUNITY

KEY DEMOGRAPHICS






POPULATION GROWTH FROM 2016 - 2021

& TRANSPORTATION


The Town of Lincoln is situated in the Greater Golden Horseshoe, in the heart of the Niagara Region on the south shore of Lake Ontario. Strategically positioned between Toronto and the U.S. Northeast, Lincoln is within a day's drive of 55% of the U.S. and 60% of Canada's population.

Lincoln boasts quick and easy access to transportation corridors that connect to the world and global economy. Lincoln serves as the affordable gateway to 130 million consumers residing in major U.S. and Canadian cities within 750 kilometers, making it an ideal location for those seeking business opportunities or settling down with their family.

ON-DEMAND TRANSIT:

Major railways pass through Lincoln, connecting the community to larger markets across Ontario and into the U.S.




QUEEN ELIZABETH WAY HIGHWAY:





When comparing the Town of Lincoln to similar municipalities and neighbouring regions, Lincoln provides competitive and affordable housing options for new residents.






AVERAGE HOUSEHOLD INCOME

INCENTIVES



NIAGARA REGION DEVELOPMENT CHARGE INCENTIVES

Niagara Region's Development Charges Reduction Program provides a major financial incentive to encourage development and redevelopment in designated exemption areas and Brownfield sites in urban areas.

Developments may be eligible for an exemption of up to 50% of applicable Regional Development Charges, if the projects satisfy a pre-defined number of Niagara's Smart Growth Design Criteria or Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) certification.







NIAGARA FOREIGN TRADE ZONE

The Niagara Foreign Trade Zone assists companies access the federal, provincial, and regional programs that support Canada's export development efforts. The Niagara Foreign Trade Zone's "one-window" approach means that it has never been easier or more efficient for businesses to navigate their way through the diverse range of support that exists.

Some programs include:

- Duty Deferral Program: Duty Relief Program, Duty Drawback on Exported Goods, Custom Bonded Warehouse can be used on their own or combined to develop a solution that meets the unique needs of your business.
- Export Distribution Centre Program: Allows companies to purchase products in Canada without paying HST up front on transactions of \$1,000.00 or more if the products are going to be exported.
- Exporters of Processing Services Program: Allows businesses to import goods tax-free if those goods are foreign-owned and going to be exported within four years. Unlike foreign trade incentives in other countries, these programs are not location specific, which offers companies more geographic flexibility.





TOURISM

The Town of Lincoln is committed to building a strong, vibrant community by ensuring sustainable growth that serves the long-term interest of our economy, businesses, environment, and our citizens. The magnificent Niagara Escarpment, picturesque Lake Ontario shoreline, and flourishing craft beverage industry are just a few of the amenities available to residents and visitors looking to explore the Niagara Benchlands. OUTDOOR ADVENTURES

The Town of Lincoln's rich rural environment offers a variety of outdoor adventures for every traveller. Whether it is a beautiful back nine, a picture-perfect Niagara picnic spot, a rolling Bruce Trail hiking route, or a storied place that instantly transports you to another time, it is easy to find a special place all to yourself in Niagara Benchlands.

HISTORY

The Lincoln Museum and Cultural Centre is home to the Jordan Historical Museum of the Twenty. There are many things to see and do at the Lincoln Museum and Cultural Centre - Visit **LincolnMuseum.ca** to browse the museum collections, exhibits, programs and workshops.









SERVICES & AMENITIES

The Town of Lincoln's municipal office is the administrative centre for the Town. The Town's various departments provide a wide range of services to the public to help meet the needs of its residents and businesses. Some services are managed by other levels of government or agencies.

SAFETY SERVICES

- Policing Services: The Niagara Regional Police Service (NRPS) serves Niagara Region including the Town of Lincoln, with the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) servicing the highway.
- Fire Services: The Town of Lincoln has four fire stations with a team of over 100 fully trained volunteer firefighters.
- Ambulance Services: Provided by the Niagara Region's Niagara Emergency Medical Services (EMS).

HEALTH CARE SERVICES

- Hospitals: There are two hospitals within 20 km that service the community, West Lincoln Memorial Hospital and St. Catharines General Hospital.
- Medical Centres:

Lincoln has three medical centres to service residents - Jordan Medical Centre, Beamsville Medical Centre, and Lincoln Medical Centre.

RECREATION AMENITIES

- Parks: The Town of Lincoln has 19 parks filled with a variety of amenities to meet the needs of all ages and abilities.
- Arenas: The Fleming Centre and Jordan Arena are the two arenas located in the Town of Lincoln.
- Sport Amenities: Three baseball diamonds, six basketball courts, and seven soccer fields offer various outdoor sport and recreation options for residents and visitors.
- Conservation Areas: Ball's Falls Conservation Area, Cave Springs Conservation Area, and Rockway Conservation Area provide picturesque scenery and walking trails to enjoy. These are managed by the Niagara Peninsula Conservation Authority (NPCA).
