

Voters FAQs

Things to Know Before You Vote

Voting will take place in person on Election day on October 24th, and online during advance voting. To receive a ballot, you must be on the Voter's List

If you are on the Voters' List you can vote for:

- The Mayor (1)
- The Office of your Ward Councillor (2)
- The Office of Regional Councillor (1)
- The Offices of School Board Trustee(s)

***Electors vote for a Trustee candidate based on the Board to which they chosen to direct their education property taxes.*

Q: Who can vote in the Municipal Election?

A: You can vote if you are:

- a Canadian citizen; and
- at least 18 years old; and
- a resident in the Town of Lincoln, or are the owner or tenant of land in Lincoln or the spouse of such owner or tenant

***You may only vote **once** in the Town of Lincoln Municipal Elections regardless of how many properties you own/rent within the Town.*

***You vote for the Ward where you live.*

Q: I am not sure if I am on the voters list for the 2022 Municipal and School Board Elections, how do I confirm this?

A: To confirm that you are on the list and that your information is accurately recorded for the upcoming municipal elections, log on to voterlookup.ca using your property address or assessment roll number and your full name and date of birth. Updating this information will help to ensure that municipal Voters' Lists are accurate and up-to-date.

Q: How do I vote? - What are my voting options?

A: All voters will be able to cast their vote either in person on election day October 24th, 2022 or during advance voting.

**Advance voting date to be confirmed*

Q: I will be out of the country during the voting period, can someone else vote on my behalf?

A: This is known as a voting proxy. To do so, you will need to fill out the form [here](#) to appoint a Proxy

Q: On voting day, what acceptable voter identifications would I need to bring?

A: ID showing your Name and Town of Lincoln Address – Review the [list of acceptable documents for voter identification](#) for more information on acceptable forms of voter identification.
