RECOMMENDATION

THAT Report CM 15–38 regarding the Jordan Historical Museum Master Site Plan provide Council with an update on the project.

PURPOSE

• The purpose of this report is to provide Council of the overview of the project as related to the Design phase.

BACKGROUND

On August 24th, 2015 during a Council meeting, minutes were presented and approved from the Community Services Committee dated August 5th, to approve and move forward with +VG Architects in an effort to carry out the Jordan Historical Museum Site Master Plan.

Subsequently, staff had hired +VG Architects and have begun the engagement process.

STAFF COMMENTS & FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

Staff had coordinated a creative kick-off meeting with a variety of interested parties. The intention of this meeting was to create some energy and excitement regarding this project. In addition to introductions, all attendees had an opportunity to share their ideas and vision, including some creative dialogue around history and culture.

For this initial meeting, invitees were represented from three distinct groups and were facilitated through a discussion by +VG Architects:



The above group represents the core team. This being said, additional community engagement will also occur as part of this process.

The results of this meeting were very positive, including ideas for reconfiguration of the entire site, a fresh focus for the museum, and consideration for the possibility of adding other new structures to the site. It was also made clear that the highest level of agreement and consensus between the community and the Town for the museum development must be reached. +VG Architects gathered all the information, comments and suggestions from each member of this initial kick off meeting and are now tasked to complete some conceptual designs and associated costing.
